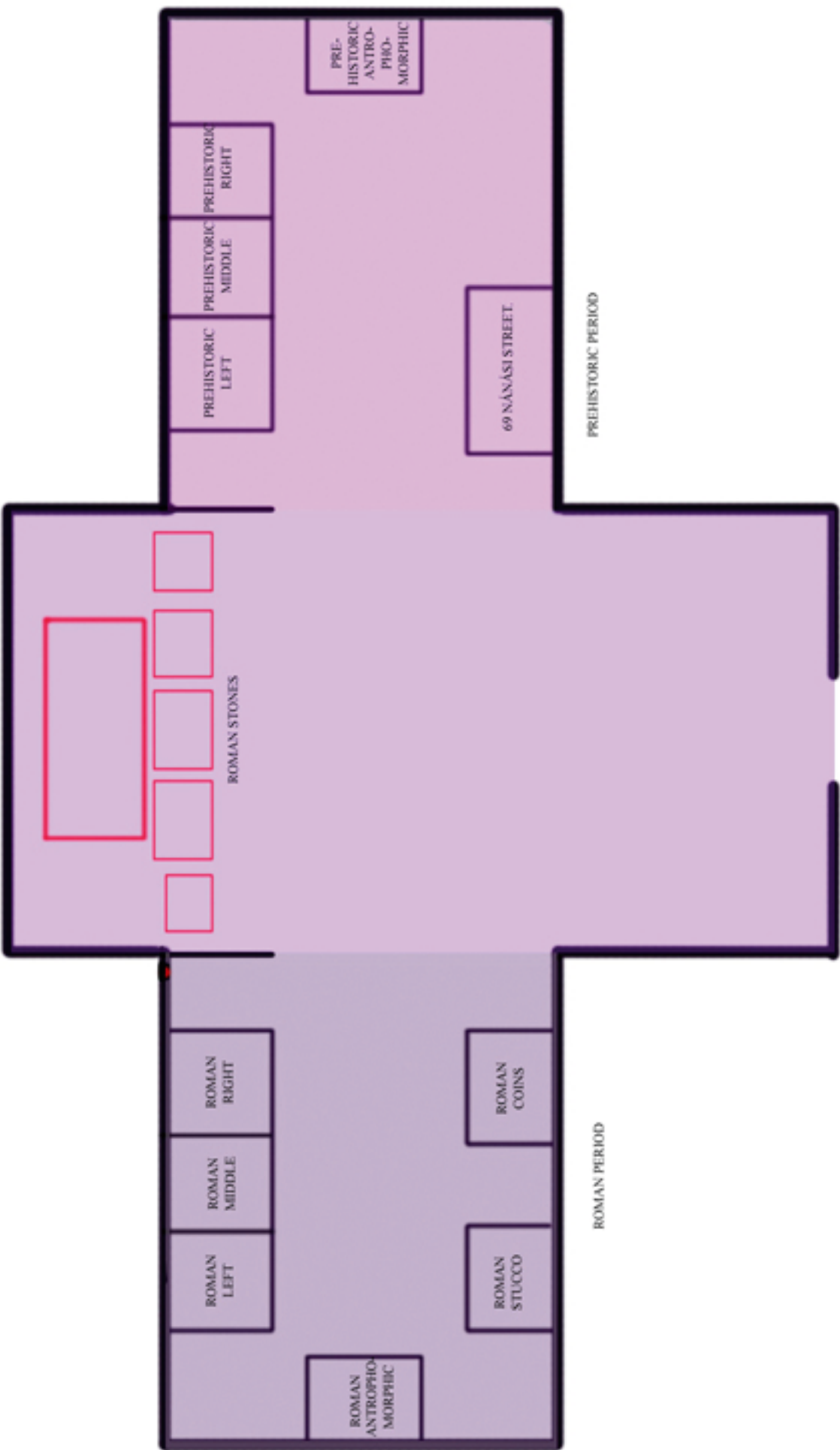

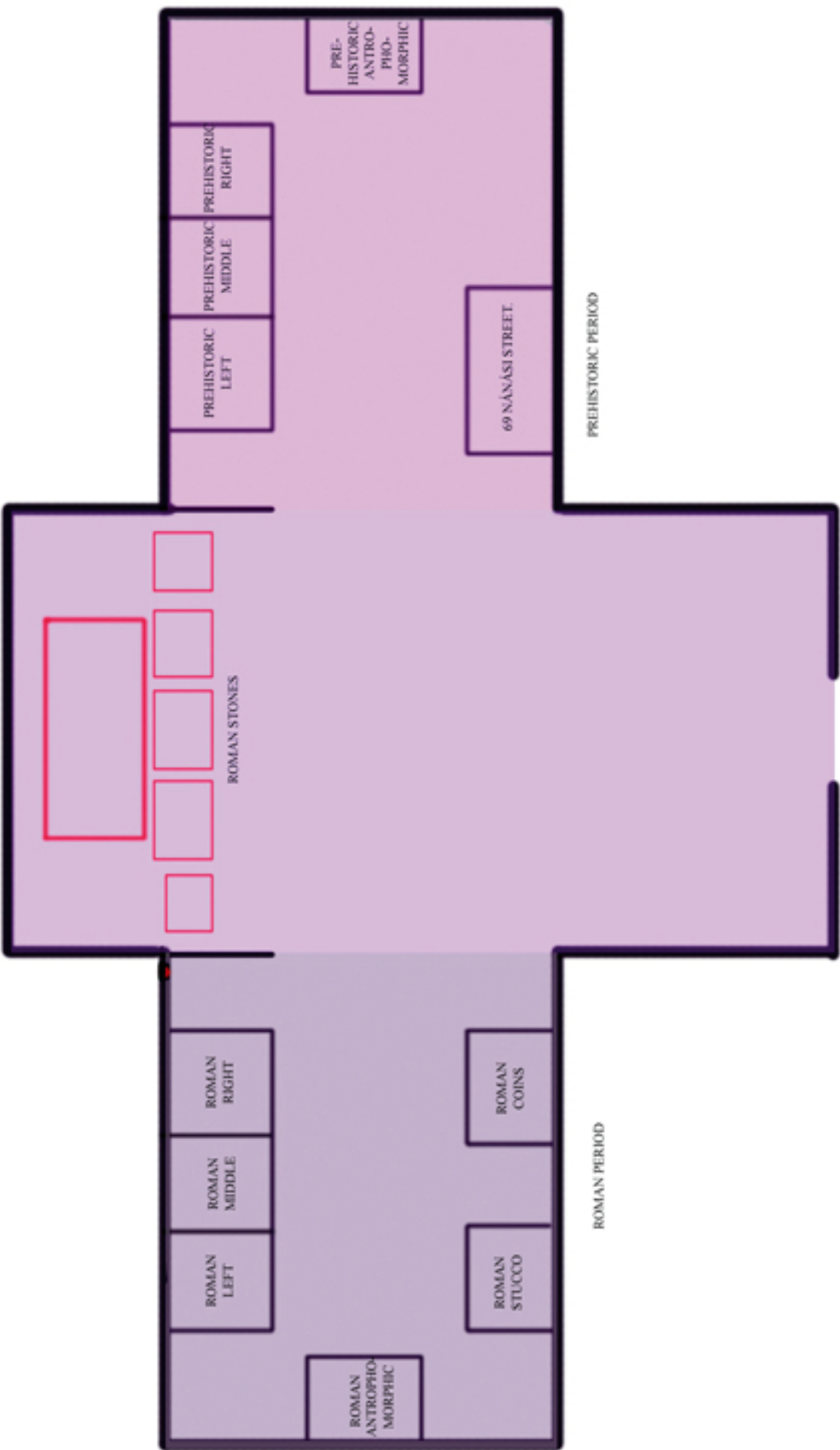

1. Armored statue

The right upper arm is also covered by fringed bands hanging from the cuirass above the embroidered tunica. A military cloak (paludamentum) hangs down from the left shoulder and is twisted around the left upper arm. The male figure is shown wearing scalloped leather boots. A scroll-box stands by the right foot.

The broken leg from the statue was built into a tomb and reflects the secondary use of this statue as building material.


